## Indian phosphoric acid prices increase \$70/tonne for Q3

Prices for Indian phosphoric acid have crossed the \$1,000/tonne threshold to reach \$1,050/tonne for Q3 2011, according to Indian consulting company Equitorials.

Indian prices of phosphoric acid – a key ingredient made from phosphate rock to manufacture fertilisers – have increased by \$70 or 7% in Q3 2011 from \$980/tonne in Q2 2011, Equitorials' managing partner Sageraj Bariya told IM.

These prices have continued to rise steadily in India for the last two years, owing to a growing demand. They have doubled compared with \$520/tonne in December 2009, reaching \$780/tonne in December 2010, \$830/tonne in March 2011 and \$900/tonne in April 2011, before reaching \$1,050/tonne in July.

This represents a 35% increase in the last six months between December 2010 and July 2011.

There is a demand-supply mismatch, commented Bariya, pointing out that "demand has also been robust on account of high agri-commodity prices".
